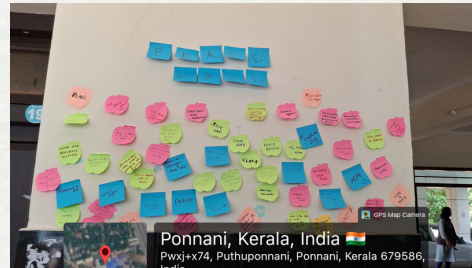

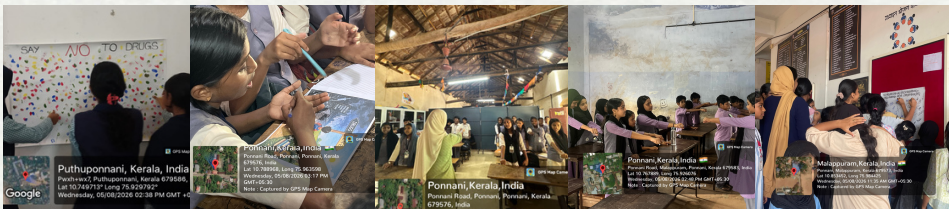

Anti-Drug Awareness Programme Conducted During Internship



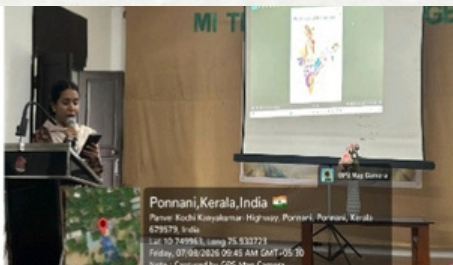

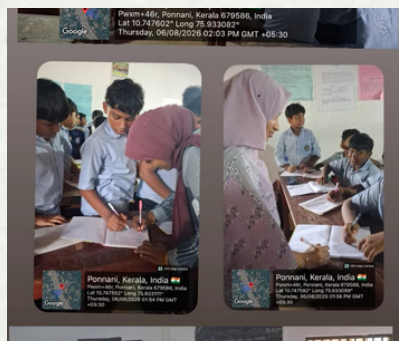
National Handloom Day Observed at MI Training College Ponnani

In Physical Science, Aslaha KV emerged first with an impressive 85.1%, followed by Nafeeda K with 84% and Surya P with 80.6%.

In Mathematics, Habeeba K secured the first position with 80.2%, followed by Fathima Nasrin PV with 78.6% and Hadya Hussain with 76.6%.

At the college level, Aslaha KV emerged as the overall topper with 85.1%, followed by Nafeeda K with 84%. Safvana P and Surya P shared the third position with 80.6%.

Hiroshima Day Programmes Organised During B.Ed. Internship
